Baltimore was America's third largest immigration port of entry from 1830-1914, after New York and Boston. Many immigrants traveled west, but those who remained found employment in Baltimore's growing commerce and industry. The Baltimore Immigration Museum is located in a former immigrant boarding house, just a few blocks from the immigration pier where 1.2 million immigrants first set foot on American soil during 1868-1914. Our Museum chronicles the stories of those who arrived and settled in our city.
